



# 396 NEW INTAKE MANIFOLD TO CYLINDER HEAD GASKETS AND END SEALS

(All 289 C.I.D. Engines)

Complaints of oil and/or vacuum leakage past the intake manifold gaskets and end seals on 289 C.I.D. engines have been received from the field.

Improved new cork Neoprene impregnated intake manifold to cylinder block and seals with improved sealing characteristics, have now been made available. This gasket has changed contours, port openings and thickness. The part number is C3AZ-9433-C, Class A.

Refer to shop manual, Section 8-57 for the removal and installation procedure. The torque specification has been raised to 20-22 ft. lbs. and the torque sequence shown should be followed to insure a good seal.

The bolt torque specifications, new seals and gaskets can be used on past model 1962-1965 221, 260 and 289 series engines.
