12 AUTOMATIC TRANSMISSION OIL COOLER HOSE LEAKAGE

(1965 Falcon, Mustang, Fairlane and Ford — Automatic Transmission)

1965 Vehicles equipped with automatic transmissions may exhibit a problem of transmission fluid leakage at the oil cooler hose connections. The (7C332) hose material composition used in some cars is such that it prevents adequate retention of the hose to the oil cooler at the radiator and oil cooler tubes when the (379011-S) Keystone type clamp is used. This hose can be identified by a cloth braid type of external surface.

Vehicles built as of September 8, 1964, have this condition corrected with the use of a new hose with a smooth external surface and softer composition.

To correct vehicles in service that leak at the transmission oil cooler hoses, it will be necessary to replace the hoses and/or type of clamps used to attach the hoses to the oil cooler at the radiator and oil cooler tubes. If it is necessary to use the braided type hose, the (379012-S8) screw type clamp must be used.

The (379012-S8) screw type clamp should be used as a service replacement on all types of cooler hose material, in preference to the (379012-S) Keystone clamp, whenever it is necessary to service a cooler hose for any reason.

C3DZ-7C332-C oil cooler hose is the only hose approved for use as a service replacement on all cars with automatic transmission. Following are the lengths of hose applicable for each vehicle.




FIG. 34-V-8 Ignition Wiring
