# 232 NEW WATER PUMP PULLEY AND POWER STEERING DRIVE BELT

(1965 – 289 CID Falcon, Fairlane, Mustang and Galaxie Equipped With Power Steering - Less Air Conditioning)

A condition of frayed or wom power steering pump belts, caused by the belt scrubbing against the water pump pulley, may be encountered on some of the subject vehicles. This problem was corrected in production November 23, 1964 by installation of a water pump pulley with a revised contour to provide adequate power steering belt clearance.

If customer complaints of the above nature are encountered, it is recommended that the water pump pulley and power steering pump belt be replaced to correct this problem.

# 400 TRANSMISSION GASKET AND OIL SEAL KIT - C4AZ-7153-C

(All With C-4 Three Speed Automatic Transmission)

Until recently, the C4AZ-7153-C kit was catalogued for 1965 model year application. The kit contains a valve body separating plate gasket C4AZ-7D100-B. This particular gasket connot be used in the 1965 model transmissions or 1964 model transmissions equipped with a service main control assembly (identified: IV). Use of this gasket in 1965 transmissions or 1964 service replacement main control assemblies results in transmission malfunction (improper shifts, low pressure, slippage, etc.)

If the transmission is a 1965 model or is equipped with a 1964 service replacement main control assembly (identified: IV), the C5AZ-7D100-B valve body sepa-

rating plate gasket must be used.
