280 SPECIAL SERVICE TOOL - CROWFOOT WRENCH FOR T. V. VACUUM DIAPHRAM

(Automatic Transmissions beginning 1959)

Since utilization of the vacuum diaphram on Ford automatic transmission a standard crowfoot (FCO-24) manufactured by Snap-On has been recommended for removing and installing the vacuum diaphram. This tool required dealer modification by grinding in order to fit in the limited adjacent space around the diaphram.

Snap-On Tools have now released this crowfoot wrench factory forged to the modified specifications. Their part number is S-8696-A. This special wrench will service all current and past model types of vacuum diaphrams used on Ford transmission of the various style cases released. Although other wrenches for this job are available most do not fit all the transmission and styles or allow access over adjacent obstructions.

This tool may be obtained from any of the National Snap-On jobbers or from Snap-On Tool, Kenosha, Wisconsin. The published list price is \$2.32.

416 DRIVESHAFT BALANCING IDENTIFICATION

(All 1965 and 1966 Ford, Fairlane, Falcon, Mustang and Thunderbird, except Mustang and Falcon Six Cylinder Models)

Complaints of excessive driveline vibration at certain driving speeds have been received from the field. It has been found, that in many cases, these vibrations have been caused by inadvertent matching of the maximum out of balance conditions of the driveshaft and rear axle universal joint companion flange.

To correct this problem in production, the light side of a driveshaft runout condition and the maximum runout condition of the universal joint companion flange have been identified with a daub of yellow paint. Matching the daub of yellow paint on the driveshaft, with the daub on the companion flange, will allow maximum balance condition possible to reduce driveline vibration complaints to a minimum.

484 SUN VISOR RELEASE EFFORT

(Ford - Fairlane - Falcon - All Sedans)

Some early produced units may encounter difficulty releasing the sun visor from the clip.

Units built after November 1, 1965, have a softer durometer rubber tip which improves the release effort considerably.

Customer complaints of this nature can be corrected by reducing the diameter of the rubber tip on the sun visor as follows:

Remove the rubber tip from the end of the sun visor shaft.

Insert the rubber tip on a short piece of 5/16 inch rod (2" long). Place this rod into a drill press or hand drill.

Reduce the diameter using sand paper or a fine file. Remove only enough material from the rubber tip to assure ease of sun visor operation.
