ALVERNIA AND THE READING COMMUNITY GRIEVE THE LOSS OF PROFESSOR ED MELEFSKY

Assistant Professor of History Edward A. Melefsky, 69, died on Tuesday, March 9, leaving a void in both the campus community and in the Reading/Berks County area that will be impossible to fill.

As student reporter Lynn Adams wrote in *The Alvernian*, the official student newspaper of Alvernia College, professor Melefsky was "a true friend and a mentor to many students."

Melefsky had been a member of the Alvernia social sciences department since 1985, teaching many courses in political science and American history. He was formerly both dean of students and student government advisor.

A 1940 graduate of Reading High School, Melefsky earned a bachelor of science degree in history from Kutztown State Teachers College and a master's degree in education from Temple University.

Outside of the classroom, Melefsky was perhaps best known for his love of antique automobiles (he owned five) and his monthly program, "Spare Parts," on Berks Community Television.

Melefsky had also published in *Automobile Quarterly*, and he was a former director of the Boyertown Museum of Historic Vehicles.




