

From route 280, exit at Eisenhower Parkway-Chatham exit. Go south to route 10. Turn right on route 10 (westbound), and proceed to the Holiday Inn. Enter the Falcon meet on the road to the right of the building.

From route 10 eastbound, go past the Holiday Inn to the U-turn (from the right).
