

"FALCON VENDORS DIVE IN TO SAVE BABY AT CARLISLE ALL FORD SHOW"

Rick and Lisa Adams own a black '66 Falcon 2dr. Sedan with a 6 cylinder and stick shift. This Falcon is very special to Rick since it was also owned by his Grandfather. They are the Club Store Managers for the Keystone Chapter of the FALCON CLUB of AMERICA. Their one year old son, Tyler, always comes along to every meet. Rick has every nook and cranny in his back seat and trunk filled with containers of T-shirts, hats, a cooler, a car seat for Tyler, and of course, everything else needed to take care of a one year old; including a full size wagon (with canopy).

Saturday morning Rick, Lisa and Tyler pulled into the 1997 All FORD Show in Carlisle, PA. Their car would not start after it was unloaded. We determined that the alternator was not charging. The first FALCON vendor to dive in and save the day was Jerry Kratz of KP Automotive in North Wales, PA. After explaining our situation, Jerry gave us a *SUPER DEAL* on a brand new alternator (in the box). We thought we were home free.

We decided to swap alternators after the judging was over at 4:00pm. An alternator swap, on a good day, should only take about 20 to 30 minutes tops. Well, we were not having a good day. The first sign of not having a good day was snapping off the nut on the bottom bracket that holds the alternator to the engine block. Getting a 4 ½ inch long bolt and nut was no problem (They even gave us a packet of Never Seize). Getting the bracket off the old alternator was our problem.

To remove the alternator from the car, we removed the 2 bolts that hold the bracket to the engine block. We unplugged the wiring harness at the starter solenoid so we could remove the wires from the alternator outside of the car. This made it easy to make sure all wires were placed properly on the new alternator. (Newer model Falcons have a molded rubber housing on the end of the wiring harness so you can't make any mistakes hooking up wires.)

The pulley and cooling fan had to be removed from the

old alternator. Luckily, Roy Kolb had the large allen wrench and the proper wrench for the large nut on the pulley. We then tried to get the broken bolt out of the alternator. We had to remove the bolt so we could reuse the bracket. Our work bench was the road in front of the car. We felt like a bunch of kids playing street hockey. Every time a car left the line-up we had to move our array of wrenches, screw drivers, rocks, and hammers out of the way. Yes, I said rocks. When you are a "Shade Tree Mechanic" you use anything at all. After pounding so much on the old alternator, mostly from frustration, the housing cracked. We finally decided that the only way to remove the bracket was to use a "Hot Wrench". Since there was no "Hot Wrench" in sight we headed back to the flea market.

It was getting late and most of the vendors were covering up their parts for the night. We went from spot to spot asking for a lower alternator bracket for a 170 six cylinder. (We didn't have to say what kind of 6 cylinder since it was an All FORD Show!) The second vendor to dive in and save the day was Chris Sheffe from Maryland. Better known as "The FALCON Guy". Chris had most of his parts covered up. When we told him we were broken down, he went to his one tarp, lifted the corner and pulled out the most beautiful, crusty looking alternator bracket (with all the hard ware attached). We asked for the price of the part, Chris just waved his hand and said "No Charge".

After getting all the parts, the installation was a snap. Rick was getting some heat from the AACA members. They wanted to know why he didn't bead blast and paint the parts. We finally finished the job at about 7:30 pm. Thanks to some great FALCON vendors, Roy Kolb, Chet Wisneski, Bruce Wolfe, and many others the day was saved. Lisa said, "If there is such a thing as a good place to break down, it's here at the All FORD Show!"

Tyler finally got to go back to the hotel to get rested up for another fun filled day at the "Carlisle All FORD Show". Tyler came back on Sunday to see Dad win third place in the '66 and up FALCON Sedan class. Maybe Tyler will be the next one to change the alternator on this FALCON. ©
