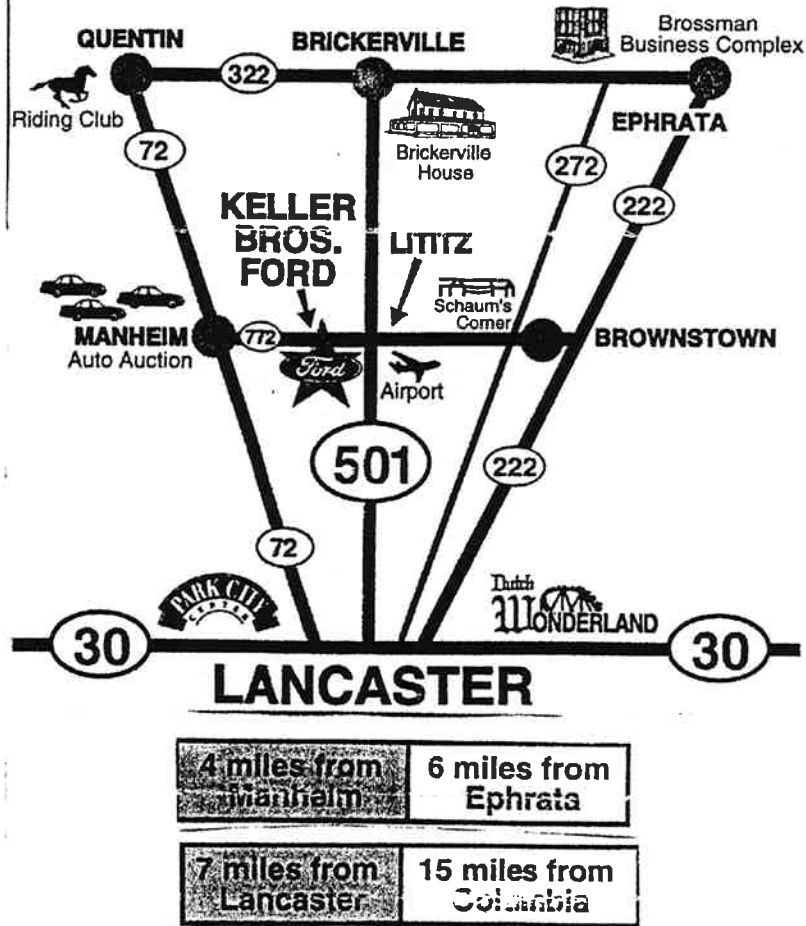

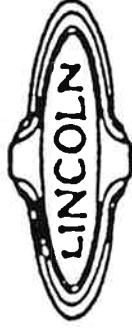

Keystone Chapter Officer's Duties

President's duties:

The President's main duty is to organize and schedule the annual meets. Some meets are run by other organizations. The dates for these standard annual meets are acquired by the President and put into the Keystone Chapter schedule of events. Other meets such as club picnics and Regional meets are decided by the club. Even though all Keystone officers and club members should promote The Falcon Club of America and the Keystone Chapter and their functions, the President is usually the main contact for the chapter. The President will run all business meetings including the election of officers at the Macungie meet { the first Sunday in August}.

It is the President's duty to make sure a Keystone club roster is sent to the FCA Secretary every January. This roster is sent by the Keystone Secretary (or Editor). It is also the President's duty to make sure Keystone functions are listed in the FCA newsletter. This duty can be assigned to other officers such as the Secretary or Editor. An E-mail correspondence is preferred by the present FCA Editor.

Vice-President's duties:

Assist the President in organizing and promoting Keystone Chapter functions. Run the business meetings at chapter functions when the President cannot attend. The Vice-President will record all cars and members that attend meets. This list should be given to the Editor for the newsletter.

Secretary's duties:

To keep a legible and accurate record of all Keystone business meetings. Record the number of cars that attend Keystone meets (get info from VP) and list any other information that made the meet memorable. The Secretary should read the previous meet minutes at every function. Keep a card file of all active Chapter members. The card file should include the following ; Name, Address, Phone number, FCA number, Dues record, Falcon Year and Model and date of original membership. At the end of each year the Secretary should review the card file and pull all inactive members. The Secretary must also notify the Editor of these inactive members so they can be removed from the mailing list. The Secretary also keeps a file of all the original membership applications. A Secretary's report should be submitted to the Editor for each newsletter. A report of the previous year is expected at the first function of every year.

WELLSBORO

Wellsboro, a town that is known for their beautiful shaded streets that are lined with gas lights. The town looks like it was taken out of A New England setting.

Wellsboro was founded in 1806 by the early New England Colonists. This town is also the county seat for Tioga County. The town was named after Mary Wells, wife of Benjamin Wister Morris, one of the original settlers. Today the town represents the fine traditions of the past that the people of this town take pride in. There are many sites to see plus old shops to go visit So come on up with our club and enjoy the fine sites to see.

The Grand Canyon of Pennsylvania is located 10 miles from town on Rte. 660. The fifty mile canyon embraces a natural waterway through the middle which is called Pine Creek. The Canyon was formed during the glacial period of time about 26,000 years ago. The canyon is bordered by two state parks, Colton Point and the Leonard Harrison Park. There are three man made lakes that surround the area. The Tioga-Hammond Lakes are located between Wellsboro and Tioga on Rte. 287, and the Cowanesque lake is on Rte. 49 near Lawrenceville.

Treasurer's Duties:

The Treasurer's main duty is to keep a record of the income and expenses of the Keystone Chapter. The Treasurer is responsible for maintaining the Keystone Chapter checking account. All new membership forms with dues are sent to the Treasurer. The original membership forms are sent to the club Secretary for filing. The Treasurer needs to send the Editor the name and complete address, FCA number, and Falcon year and model of all new members. This information keeps the mailing list up to date and gives the Editor the new members for listing in the newsletter. The Treasurer receives all club dues and must report all paid up members to the club Secretary. Note: The Treasurer can also receive "New Membership Dues" for the FCA along with "New Membership Dues" for the Keystone Chapter. These FCA dues are sent to the FCA with the membership form. This makes it easier for new FCA members to join our chapter.

Editor's duties:

The Editor's duties include publishing and mailing 6 newsletters each year in the following months, January, April, June, July, August and October. A Keystone membership directory is also published by the Editor and handed out to active members at club functions. The format of the newsletter is up to the Editor. The Editor is responsible for keeping a current membership mailing list. This is done with help from the Treasurer and Secretary. A list of new Keystone members must be placed in the newsletter. This information is received from the club Treasurer.

All Officer's duties:

It is the duty of all Keystone officers to promote the Falcon Club of America and the Keystone Chapter and their functions. All officers are encouraged to submit a message for each newsletter.
