Keystone Regional Class Information

After much discussion about the Masters Class and previous Keystone Best of Show winners it has been decided that the Masters Class will be AACA Jr and Sr winners only. This is an optional class.

Master's Class:

A person with an AACA winner can opt to be in his class and not in the Masters Class. The benefit of the Masters Class is that the entry will automatically receive a Plaque and is also eligible for Best of Show and Ladies Choice awards. If you are intending to enroll your car in this class you must be in current standing with the AACA. Enrollment must also be at least SIX weeks prior to the show.

Previous Keystone Best of Show winners:

It has been decided that the 2000 Best of Show Winner will not be eligible for Best of Show participation at the 2004 Keystone Regional. The Best of Show winner from 2000 will be eligible to participate in the class he or she is assigned and will also be eligible for the Ladies Choice Award, Oldest Falcon & Longest Distance.



A Twenty Year Promise

The Sale of a 1963 Falcon Futura Convertible

I was introduced to Bill and Nancy Rogers in the early seventies by a friend to repair their television sets. I saw a 1963 Falcon Futura in their garage and I began dreaming of owning one.

The car was purchased from a Riverside Ford Dealer in March of 1963 for \$2760. I said to Nancy, "If you ever decide to sell your convertible, let me be the first person to offer to buy it"

I repaired their television sets through the years, always asking about the convertible. In late 1980, Nancy and Bill were divorced and I thought the chances of owning that convertible was gone. In 1996 Bill called me to repair his television set I asked him if the convertible was still around. He said that Nancy had parked it in 1991 in a garage and decided she did not want to drive it anymore. Nancy said she was willing to sell the convertible to me..

In 1996 Nancy called me about the purchase of the car. I made an appointment to see her. She showed me the car in the garage. The car had four fiat tires, the wheels were locked up. The top and the seats needed cleaning. I had to call my brother who owns a "roll back" so we could move the car out of the garage to assess the condition. I hadn't seen the vehicle since the early eighties and it had not been driven for many years. We found it all in tack. After examining it, we found the gas tank had a hole in it and the battery was dead, so it was unable to run. Since the car was not in running condition, we were able to negotiate a reasonable price. Nancy gave me all the service records. To my surprise the motor was rebuilt in 1978 at a local garage. The odometer showed 80 thousand miles when the motor was rebuilt and when I looked at Odometer recorded in 1996, it was one hundred thousand miles (100,000).

My brother and I loaded me car on to the "roll back" and brought it home to my yard. I had to clean the top and the seats to remove the mildew from storage in the garage.

With a new tank and carburetor I was able to get the car running. Now it was ready for four new radial tires. In the spring of 1997 I installed re-chromed bumpers and fender skirts. It was now ready for some local car shows. I joined the "Falcon Club of America". The membership of this club allowed me to purchase Falcon parts through our newsletters which listed parts for classic Falcons.

The whiter of 1998, a new paint job was done and new "spinner" hub caps were intalled. In 1998 I attended a local car show and won a few trophies in its class.

In 1999, new upholster and a new steering wheel were added. I was off to The Carlisle All Ford National and was surprised that I came in first in my Falcon's class, and there were a lot of nice Falcons there. I had a good time and was especially proud of my special "Promise" car.
