A Falcon Chasing a Pheasant

It was a beautiful Saturday morning. I was removing some needed parts from a parts car. No it wasn't a Falcon, it was a Mercury Lynx. I'm fixing a wrecked Mercury Lynx. It's my beater car. (\$200.00 car). I'm trying to escape the high cost of driving an F-150 truck back and forth to work. Ever since I bought the F-150 (last January) gas prices have been rising. I should get double the gas mileage with the Lynx. I know what you're thinking...., what about all the other costs of a third vehicle? Well, I'd rather give the money to the local people than to the oil companies. I'm getting way off the subject!

I was loading my Lynx parts into my wheelbarrow and I heard this rumble behind me. I looked around and it was a dark green 1965 Falcon Ranchero.
