

My Friend and My 13/16 socket

Some time in December of 06 during the warm spell I decided to change the spark plugs in my 1968 Falcon. I proceeded to Auto Zone and purchased 8 Champion RF 11YC plugs. While at Auto Zone not only did I purchase the plugs the salesman advised me to purchase a small packet of never seize for the plug threads and a Vaseline type grease to coat the body of the plug so the rubber boots will be easier to remove on the next change.

Arriving home I armed myself with my trusty Craftsman 3/8 inch drive socket wrench, double extensions and my 13/16 inch socket and proceeded to the 68 for some Spark Plug changing. I invented this rubber hose tool that you slip over the plug and the other end over the ratchet extension. I would then thread the plug into the block. I then removed the hose from the ratchet wrench and attached the 13/16 inch socket to tighten the plug into the block.

Between the never seize and the Vaseline type mixture everything became quite difficult to handle. Everything went ok until the last two plugs on the right rear of the engine where the brake booster is located. First the 13/16 inch socket took leave passing the suspension and coming to rest on the garage floor. Down onto the floor I went to retrieve the socket. Next I knocked the ratchet wrench down onto the floor down I went again. The socket took leave on an additional two occasions, each time I was down on the floor under the car looking for the socket. The last time the socket took leave I looked under the car but I could not locate the socket. I got under the car and checked the suspension, the exhaust, the floor under the car and around the car but no socket. I had completed the plug installation prior to the socket taking leave so I was ok.

I decided to back the car out of the garage and take it for a spin. I figured the socket would appear when I backed from the garage but alas no socket. I drove around and thinking that the socket must have taken leave from the car and would be a find for the road side trash gatherers or a road walker.

Having a socket set with a socket missing is like having a telephone without service, it just doesn't work. Several weeks of searching left me with no options except to purchase another 13/16 inch deep well Craftsman socket and so I did.

The residence next to mine is vacant due to the death of the two elderly people who lived there. Their son Dale who was an auctioneer used the property for storage and to park his box truck. The houses are next to each other and the garages are at the rear of the properties.

The Friday before Valentines Day in the afternoon I decide to move my cars around. At present I am keeping my sons Volvo so this move involved four cars a truck and a utility trailer. I moved the 68 and 66 Falcons from their garage taking a couple laps around the parking lot to the rear of my residence near to where my

neighbor's son parked his truck. Apparently Mr. 13/16 socket was lodged somewhere on the 68 and decided to dislodge itself and take flight landing in the area where Dale parked his truck.

When ever I was working in my garage and Dale would come home late at night from a sale or setting up at a sale he and his dog Sparky would stop and we would talk about cars or other type automotive items he was selling at an upcoming sale. In the summer when he would bring items from sales to store in the house Dale and his wife along with Sparky and my wife Connie would sit on the wall out front of the house and talk for hours about sales and the neighborhood. On occasion I would leave my garage door open and Dale would call and advise me the door was open. If anything was suspicious at his place I would call him.

The Friday before Valentines Day Dale telephoned my house and advised my wife that he found this 13/16 inch socket where he parked his truck and figured it belonged to me because I was the only one in the neighborhood that worked on cars. Dale questioned whether I had purchased a replacement socket. Connie said no, even though she knew I had. Dale told her he would see that I got the socket back. Dale never liked to have his picture taken but decided the Sunday before Valentines Day he would go to Lancaster and have his picture taken for his wife Charlotte for Valentines Day.

While at the photographer Dale had a massive heart attack and died. That evening some friends of the family came to my residence to inform my wife and I of Dale's death, they also related that Dale told his wife about the socket and she would return it as soon as it was located.

Later that night someone brought Dale's truck back and parked it. The interior light was left on so I went out to check if the truck was unlocked. I checked the doors and found them to be locked. As I looked into the truck I saw my 13/16 socket on the console of the truck. Several days later I went out to go to work and the socket was sitting on my tool box.

This story is dedicated to the memory of our friend Dale Putt. Good bye Dale, Connie and I will miss you.

A large selection of Falcons is desired for the display on all 3 days. In addition to the cars under the tent, Falcons will be displayed immediately outside the tent. To encourage participation (under or outside the tent), FCA members whose Falcons are displayed for 2 of the days will receive a rebate from the Keystone Chapter of \$10. FCA members whose Falcons are displayed for all 3 days will receive a rebate of \$20. These rebates are based on the Macungie early registration fee and will be paid on Sunday, August 5th.

Be sure to check out the enclosed Macungie flyer for information on the 3 day event. Your car registration includes a maximum of 4 people per car. You will receive a participation award every day your car is registered and driven onto the show field. Some awards in the past were a beach towel, an air pump, tote bag, floor jack, road atlas, etc..... The gate is open for show cars from 8 a.m. to 12 noon each day. Remember...... There is **NO DAY OF SHOW REGISTRATION.** Early registration is \$10.00 per day before January 1st, 2007. Regular registration is \$13.00 per day and the deadline is July 1st, 2007.

Friday, August 3rd is for Street Rods, Customs, Modified, Race Cars, Trucks, Sports Cars and all cars 1895 to 1987. (maximum 800 cars). Saturday, August 4th is open to all cars to 1982. No street rods, customs or modified cars. Special awards to all National AACA – Senior & First Junior – H.P.O.F. and Pre-1920. Free registration to all up to 1920. (maximum 1,300 cars) Sunday, August 5th is limited to the cars listed on the registration form (maximum 1,300 cars). You need not be a club member to attend this 3 day show.

Please note that <u>Macungie does not consider cars with non-factory paint, non-factory wheels, or non-factory engines to be modified UNLESS the engine projects above the hood of the car.</u> All modified Falcons are welcomed on Friday only, both under and outside the "Feature Falcon Tent".

A large car flea market and car corral are available for your shopping pleasure. There will be 2 big tents and one building full of handmade crafts for sale. Be sure to bring your swimming suit to enjoy the Macungie park pool. There will be entertainment every day with fireworks on Saturday evening.
