# In Memory - Richard E. Hostetter (71)

It's with our deepest sorrow to inform everyone that the Falcon Club of America and especially the Keystone Chapter has lost one of their longtime members - Richard E. Hostetter. Richard passed away on April 7, 2008 at his home surrounded by his loving family. Rich, his wife Paula, and their dog Sneakers were staples at Keystone events and many National meets over the years. An enthusiastic and abundant Falcon owner over his lifetime, his two most recent Falcons were his white 63 2dr Futura and his red 63 Convertible. A constant preacher of the 6 cylinder engine, he too fell victim for "the need for speed" and reluctantly transplanted a V8 into his convertible. (Deep down I think he had wished he had listened to himself and kept his 6 cylinder).

He retired with 34 years service from the H.B. Reese Candy Company; was a US Air Force veteran; member of Sherk's Meeting House, the Annville American Legion, and Country Cruisers.

Since so many of you requested the recipe for Pam Wolfe's cookies at the Regional in May, we decided to put it in the newsletter! Enjoy!

#### **Butter Crunch Cookies**

- 2 cups butter (no substitutes), softened
- 2 cups sugar
- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons cream of tartar
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 4 cups cornflakes, lightly crushed
- 1 cup chopped pecans

Cream butter and sugar together.

Combine flour, cream of tartar, baking soda and salt.

Gradually add to the creamed mixture.

Stir in the cornflakes and pecans.

Roll in 1-in. balls. Place 1-in. apart on ungreased baking sheets.

Bake at 350 degrees for 10-12 minutes or until lightly

Cool for 2 minutes before removing to wire racks.

Yield: about 8 dozen.
