

The rule of thumb is if you don't drive your Falcon enough to replace your tires every five years then you should replace them on your own every five years. It may save your life.

Detroit National Convention



The Metro Detroit Chapter hosted the 31st National Convention. This Convention also celebrated the 50th anniversary of the Ford Falcon. The National was held at Dearborn Hyatt Regency Hotel with five glass elevators. It was a very nice and orderly national. From the agenda, that was placed on the back of the name tags so all you had to do was flip your name tag over and you could see when the next event was taking place, to the ample parking on the show field. 316 Falcons from Pure Stock to Heavy Modifies. Falcons chopped in half to a 4 wheel drive Ranchero and every kind of Falcon in between were at this event.

Many events were furnished by the Metro Detroit Chapter. An evening of movies, popcorn and sodas in addition to an Ice Cream social interrupted by 60 mph winds that sent people running for cover. There was a tour of the Roush store and museum and a tour of the 43 acres of Ford Development test Track. Two waves of Falcons with 100 in each wave made their way to the test track. What an awesome sight. Edsel Ford Jr. the great grandson of Henry Ford made a brief appearance at the test track speaking to all in attendance about the future of Ford. Also available were tours of the Ford museum, Village and Truck Plant. A mall across from the hotel provided entertainment for many of the women.

On Saturday, free ice cream was provided by Hudsonville Creamery & Ice Cream Company. Saturday evening was a delicious meal and awards. Keystone FCA members in attendance were Gerald Kratz Sr & Jerry Kratz Jr, 1963 Ranchero; Paul Leonetti along with his wife Chrissy and family members, 1964 Falcon Futura Sdn.; Bruce and Pam Wolfe in Bonnie Blue 1968 Futura; Don & Connie Snyder, 1968 Falcon Sports Coupe; James Larkin, 1963 Sprint. Members attending without Falcons, Frank & Ginny Servas, Craig & Pat Pheasant along with Mike, Tom and Steve Pateski.

While traveling to the National Gerald Kratz Sr. & Jr. were driving in a construction area on I 80. The traffic came to a halt because of an accident. Sitting there Jerry Kratz Jr. noticed a woman waiving from the car ahead. Jerry having no idea who the woman was stayed seated in his falcon until Frank Servas got out of the vehicle ahead and walked back to Jerry. It was Ginny who was waiving at Jerry. Frank and the Kratz family spent the time waiting for the accident to clear discussing Falcons. All thought it quite amazing that they would meet one another in traffic so far from home.

The FCA Board of Directors after much deliberation has decided to raise the membership dues from \$25.00 a year to \$30.00 per year.

In addition the Masters Class will be defined as the Best of Show Winners in Stock and Modified at the National these winners will remain in this class for (3) years and at the end of the 3rd year each pair will be removed. Refer to FCA monthly magazine for a complete explanation.

The Keystone Chapter had 2 casualties the first being an Ice cream container lid that apparently escaped the social during the 60mph winds and came to rest on the roof of Paul Lionetti's falcon and was discovered the

next morning. No permanent damage to the car. The lid was destroyed. The next was the muffler explosion of Bonnie Blue's muffler as Pam and Bruce were leaving the National homeward bound. The explosion was fatal to the muffler. Bruce found enjoyment with the sound especially traveling through the turnpike tunnels. Bruce was heard repeating over and over (I wish I had a V-8).

This is one of the nicest stock Falcon wagons you will find. This beauty won first place in its class at 2 Falcon Club of America National conventions in Nashville, TN and Cromwell, CN (driven to both shows from Central PA). This car was restored on a rotisserie. It has a 200 CU. IN. six cylinder with a 3 speed stick transmission. All parts of the car were removed and stripped to bare metal and painted with epoxy primer. All 35 pieces of stainless were removed and buffed. The interior was also painted and restored to stock including a new head liner and a restored steering wheel. Many NOS parts were used in the restoration including the tail gate emblem and window crank. The restoration included a new windshield, all 4 door rubbers and rechromed bumpers. Last year a new Autolite battery was installed. Non-Stock items are: Mag Wheels (I have the stock wheels and hub caps), 200 six instead of 170 and an alternator instead of a generator. 7 Layered Salad (9 X 13 Pan)

Ingredients

- 1. Lettuce (bite size)
- 2. Red Cabbage (chopped)
- 3. Carrots (shredded)
- 4. 1 Green Peppers (diced)
- 5. 10 oz. Frozen Peas (thawed)
- 6. Onion (chopped)
- 7. 4 Hard Boiled Eggs (sliced)

Dressing

- 1. 32 oz. Miracle Whip Dressing
- 2. 4 Table Spoons Sugar
- 3. Shredded Sharp Cheese
- 4. Bacos (or crumbled bacon)

This is called 7 Layered Salad. Layer the first 7 ingredients starting with the lettuce.

Then mix Miracle Whip and Sugar together and spread over salad ingredients (edge to edge). Refrigerate until serving time. Sprinkle cheese and Bacos on top before serving.
