Future Falcon Projects by Jerry Kratz- FCA #2692

I have always been interested in cars that have a history of some type or a story that goes with it. I am also always looking around for cars that are sitting in garages, back yards, etc. I have been reading a series of books that started with "The Cobra in the barn" by Tom Cotter which deals with barn finds and cars that have been found with a history. Some of the stories in these books talk about cars that have been sitting for years and years with an owner saying he will fix it up one day or a person who is just a "collector" of old cars just to say he has one. I always thought, how can someone do this to an old car and then realized I am one of these people. I have been collecting Falcons since 1982 and have been selling new and used parts for falcons since 1996. I have a small collection of Falcons that I have been holding onto for some time that I thought maybe I would share a few of them with you and the story about each one.





FALCON # 1 is a 1963 Falcon Sprint, 260 auto with power steering. When I was going to tech school in 1984 this car was sitting on a used car lot down from school and it's appearance was about the same as it is now. I test drove this car and noticed it had a bad pull to the left. When I got back to the lot I noticed it had a broken left shock tower and the left front wheel was tilted in. To say the least I didn't buy it. Jump to 1991 and my father called about a 63 sprint that was in the local auto trader and wanted to go look at it. When we went to look at it I was surprised to find that it was the same Falcon I looked at seven years earlier. The gentleman had purchased it from the same used car lot and had not noticed the broken shock tower until after he had purchased it. He had not done really anything to it during his ownership. This Falcon sat in my parent's barn from 1991 to 1994 and has been sitting here since then under a cover. The only thing that has happened to it sitting outside is the cover is wearing the black spray paint off that was on it and showing the original color.

FALCON # 2 is a 1964 Falcon Futura hardtop, 260 4 speed, Rangoon Red with black bucket seat interior. I have many people call me looking for Falcons. I had spotted this car about a week before I had a gentleman call me looking for a 64 hardtop. This person had called me many times before and has tried to buy one of my car's (I am going to fix it when I have time, you know the story). I hadn't had time to stop and look at this car yet and just wanted to give him a lead on a car so I told him where it was. He called me a couple weeks later and told me he had purchased the car and that is was a factory 260 4 speed car. I was dumbfounded that I had given this car up without first looking at it. I told him if he ever wanted to sell it I would be interested. About a year later he called me and needed money and wanted to sell. He had changed out the seized 260 engine with a 302 and sprayed grey primer on the fenders and doors. Even though the car is rough, I had a 64 Rangoon Red hardtop early on and wanted to replace it. I bought it for double what he originally paid for it. This Falcon has been sitting in this place with a cover over it since 1994.

FALCON # 3 is a 1963 Falcon Futura convertible, 260 auto with power steering. This car came as a parts car with my 1963 Falcon Sprint convertible I purchased in 1982 which was my first car (and still own). This Falcon has major rust issues, had a 289/FMX enginetrans combo stuck in it and no front sheet metal (which we came to find out was on my Sprint). For some reason I have not been able to part with this car. It was in my parent's barn from 1982 until 1994, then was in my pole building from 1994 to 2001 and has been sitting in this place since with a cover over it. This Falcon is destine to be a parts car for my wife's 63 convertible which came to me missing a lot of little stuff (window regulators, door latches, etc).

LB Smith Side Story

It was Saturday, October 18, 2014. New KCFCA members Mark & Donna Martin from Edison, NJ were making their first trip to a Keystone Chapter event. They arrived at the LB Smith show in Lemoyne, PA. They parked their red 1964 Futura Convertible and put the top down. This Falcon used to belong to long time KCFCA member Rheal Meilleur from Canada. The weather was a bit nippy and Mark decided to get his jacket from the trunk. As I walked up to take a picture of his Falcon he said, "Bruce, I need your help. I locked my keys in the trunk". That week I happened to be checking out what hardware I needed to put a new convertible top on my wife's 63 Futura. So I was familiar with the construction of a convertible and what it looked like under the convertible top well. Mark had put the top down but we were still able to put it up without the keys. I asked Mark if he had a Phillips screw driver to remove the snaps across the back of the seat. He said yes, I have one in the glove box. He opened the glove box and said sorry I put it in the trunk. I reached in my pocket for my pocket knife. It had a screw driver on it. We took about three quarters of the snaps off so Mark could slide into the trunk for his keys. Pennsylvania Bill to Provide for Year-of-Manufacture Plates Signed Into Law

Pennsylvania legislation to provide vehicle owners the option of using vintage, original model-year license plates on antique and classic vehicles was signed into law by Governor Tom Corbett. Under the new law, an application fee of \$75 would be charged to use year-of-manufacture plates. The law provides that vintage plates must have been issued by the state of Pennsylvania between the years 1906 and 1975, must be provided by the vehicle owner and legible from a reasonable distance. There is no obligation to pay the fee for model year license plates. Antique vehicle owners may still apply for special antique, classic or collectible plates that bear the designation 'antique vehicle.'
