It is not likely there will be any car shows this year. So far, the National and four regionals have cancelled, ours being one. We alternate regional years with the Mason-Dixon Chapter (MD). They offered to put on a co-regional next year or push their next regional out to 2022 allowing us to have ours in 2021. For those that have been around a while, co-regionals used to be the norm. I am guessing the term Regional use to mean several neighboring chapters getting together for a show. As chapters grew, each chapter had enough resources to hold their own show. The pendulum has swung the other way. Our membership is less than half what it once was. Our 2018 Regional was put on by a few hard-working members. After which it was announced that 2020 would likely be the last Keystone Regional unless more members participated. We started last year calling out for volunteers. Fewer answered the call than in 2018. The club officers decided to do the best we could with what we had for the 2020 show. We actually had a nice show lined up. A big worry was that too many Falcons would show up. Going forward we have four options; (1) cohost with MD in 2021, (2) hold our own show in 2021, (3) skip our next allowing MD to hold their regional in 2021 or (4) discontinue Keystone regionals until further notice. We have decided on option (3) to not reschedule 2020. We may have a Keystone Regional in 2022, but even that is questionable. We need your help! WHAT ARE YOU WORKING ON KRIS KOLLAR?

My major project was reupholstering the seats in my 63 Convertible. It was a challenging job and I used / cut a lot more hog rings than an experienced pro would. There were three layers of old seat covers that I removed, the original '63 versions, and then two newer layers on top as well. Check out the finished front / rear seat bottom and the rear seat upright section. The seat frames were completely stripped, treated for rust, repainted and all broken springs were repaired / replaced. This winter I've also refurbished the instrument cluster by stripping a former owner's blue over spray paint off of it, replacing the voltage regulator and repairing the generator and oil idiot lights and refurbishing the turn signal and high beam indicators as well. I've repaired the heat temperature knob / cable mechanism and this past weekend repaired the fan motor switch and cable assembly. Lastly, I've replaced the instrument cluster wire harness, am in the process of replacing the parking brake cable / drum brake actuator mechanism and I am also working on installing new exhaust / tail pipes because the previous owner really dorked them up. That's all for now. Kris

WHAT ARE YOU WORKING ON JIM OGRAM?

I have a 302ci, 2000 rebuild, from early 80s in a 64 Ranchero. It has one of those older style ignition control modules (ICM). Picture attached. The thing was showing signs of going bad. It would rudely turn off the ignition randomly going down the road or even idling in the garage. Rather than blow \$30 on a new ICM, I figured what a better excuse to put in that old/used MSD box my brother in-law sold me eight years ago for \$50. The directions seemed simple enough. It was just that it would require \$75 worth of new wires to put it in the cockpit where I wanted it. Not sure why, but I unplugged the existing ICM before ordering the proper wire. The connector tabs were a blueish green. Seems the dielectric gel had gone bad. Cleaned the connectors, applied fresh gel and presto, two 45 minute test drives with no issues. As insurance, I did purchase a spare ICM and keep in under the seat for those on the road "oh darn" moments. Lesson learned.

Installed a new aluminum radiator after painting it with Eastwood radiator paint. The can said something about do not apply below 50 degrees and primer not recommended. The fins are fine, but the top endcap wrinkled off. Not sure if it was my 45 degree basement or not bringing the radiator up to operating temperature to cure it. Anyhow, I repainted the endcap with primer and BBQ paint. Will see how long that lasts. Lesson learned. Jim Ogram

NEW SHIRT IN OUR KCFCA "TRUNK"




- 1. To order go to "The Trunk" menu on our KCFCA site www.FordFalcon.org.
