

Directions:

From the PA Turnpike (either direction) get off at exit 18 (Harrisburg West). Once you pass thru the tollbooth take I-83 North. Within 2-3 miles the road splits. You want to be in the right lane continuing on l-83 North towards Harrisburg. Once you take this turn towards Harrisburg stay in this lane. Get off at the 2nd exit (#42/Lemoyne). This exit ramp loops around and over a bridge. This is 3rd street. At the second red-light turn left. This is Market Street in Lemoyne. L.B. Smith is a short distance (half a mile roughly) up on the left.

NOTE: The speed limit on Market Street in Lemoyne is 25 mph

From I-81 (either direction) take exit #65 (Marysville/Enola) Rte's 11 & 15. Follow Rte.'s 11 & 15 South toward Enola. You will travel thru several small towns (Summerdale, Enola, and West Fairview). You will eventually see a sign for a right turn onto Rte.'s 11 & 15.

DO NOT MAKE THIS TURN.

Continue straight thru the town of Wormleysburg. Watch your speed and be alert for people in crosswalks. This is for a mile or two. You will come to a red-light where it is a left or right turn only. Go right. This is what is termed "The Bottleneck" from Lemoyne to Wormleysburg. You want to be in the right lane. At the next light continue straight onto Market Street in Lemoyne. L.B. Smith is within half a mile roughly on the left side.

L.B. Smith Ford is the only New Car/Truck Dealership left in Lemoyne.
