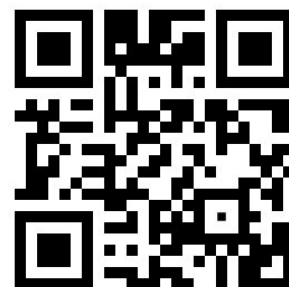

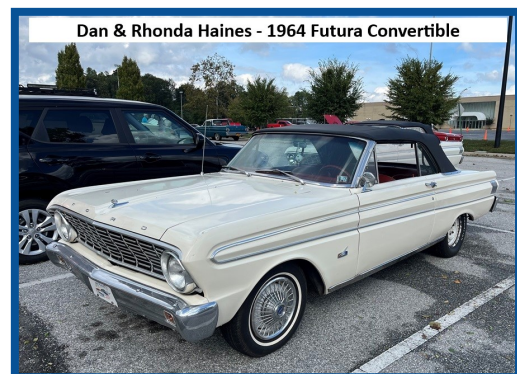
Driving Into a Hurricane

We made plans long ago to attend the Carolina's Regional in Shelby, NC. We checked the weather for Shelby, NC on Wednesday before leaving Thursday morning for the FCA Regional Meet. It showed possible rain on Thursday, 100% chance of rain on Friday and sunny and clear on Saturday. What we didn't see, at that time, was the hurricane coming across NC. So, we headed off early for our trip to Shelby, NC. Halfway through Virginia it started to rain, and it continued most of the way to the show hotel. We got to the hotel safe and sound. The Falcon doesn't leak when driving in the rain. But we found out on Saturday it will leak with 50 MPH winds swirling all around it.

As usual, the Carolina's Chapter took care of us. We went to a 100-year-old carousel on Thursday and then off to eat at a downtown restaurant. The hotel provided a great breakfast, and the CCFCa provided us with lunch and dinner on Friday. We had hot dogs and more for lunch. So we didn't have to go out in the storm, they graciously provided "Tube Steaks" (hot dogs again) for dinner. They also supplied tacos for Saturday lunch and if you signed up for the banquet you had pulled pork and bar-b-que chicken for dinner.

The hotel never lost power or cable service. The cell service was a little sketchy. The show went off as planned with about half the pre-registered Falcons attending. They sent an email to you with a link to your video. All in all, the show was great. We didn't know the full extent of the turmoil west of us until we got home. Our trip home on Sunday was uneventful. We started counting the electric trucks heading south once on I 81. We counted 106 trucks. We were so lucky to be home safe and sound.
